CONDITIONS:

1. Horses must exceed 148cm without shoes.
2. Open to horses foaled in 2015 and 2016.
3. Saddlery: (warm-up and competition): tack as per British Eventing Rules for Novice Dressage - snaffle bridle only, see website www.britisheventing.com. Running martingale only and front boots are optional for sections I, II and IV. However, NO hind boots or bandages of any kind may be worn in the collecting ring, warm-up area or actual class. Jumping whip only allowed (max length 75cm)..
4. DRESS: As for British Eventing Novice Dressage Test/Hunting Dress. British Eventing / BHS approved hat and harness to be worn **for all sections**.
5. Opening Date: 14/05/20
6. Closing Date: 11/06/20. In the event of oversubscription this class may be closed early.
7. Balloting: in the event of over subscription entries received for horses that have already qualified for the Final will be balloted first.
8. Entries: entries to "The Event Secretary, online entries will be accepted on Keysoe.com Please make cheques payable to "The College EC"
9. Withdrawals: by 20:00 Friday 19th June – info@keysoe.com.
10. Starting Times: available on website from 23/06/20
11. **Horses will be ridden by the judge at the Final.**
12. Perceived Potential Conflict of Interest: Within the equestrian community there may be times when this occurs. For guidance, it has been determined that a perceived/potential conflict of interest could arise in the event that an appointed judge has a previous or current connection to a horse entered in the competition. Examples of such connections and interests include, but not limited to, the following. The judge has; bred or previously owned the horse, or acted as an agent in its sale; previously competed, trained or kept the horse at livery; previously or currently had a financial or other interest in the horse. In the event that a judge/owner/rider (or their agent) knows of, or should know of, any potential and/or perceived conflict of interest in a horse entered in the competition they must declare this to the Organiser as soon as it is known. Steps will be taken to manage it as practically as possible.
13. It is a condition of entry that all riders, owners, grooms, and their connections/relatives, must conduct themselves and communicate in a respectful manner towards the public, officials, and all other parties present or entered in the competition. Such behaviour includes respect for the Judges and their decisions, which are final. Offensive behaviour, and/or other violations of this condition, may lead to sanctions such as disqualification and future bans.

DISCLAIMER: Except for the negligence of the Organisers and his or their agents or others for whom in law they are responsible, the Organiser does not accept responsibility in respect of any accident, loss, damage, injury, disease or illness caused to or suffered by any horse, owner, rider, spectator, sponsor and others present at the

JUDGING

SECTION I Dressage Test (60m x 20m) Arena
Marks will not be awarded for individual movements but the test will be marked for general impression and overall performance.

TEST

To be ridden from memory

A Enter in working trot
From X proceed directly to
M Working trot
C Serpentine 3 loops each loop to go to side of the arena finishing at A
F X H Change rein showing some lengthened strides
(Not required for 4 year olds)
Between Working canter right
H&C
C Circle right 20m diameter
M X K Change rein with transition to trot between X and K
Between Working canter left
K&A
A Circle left 20m diameter
Between A&F Working trot
Between F&B Medium walk
B Half 20m circle left in free walk on a long rein to E
E Directly to A - leave arena free walk on a long rein

To be followed immediately by:

SECTION II Jumping. NO time will be allowed between these sections for any adjustment to tack or rider's dress. Maximum height of fences 0.90m (4 years) 1.05m (5 years). **Fall of horse or rider or a total of 3 refusals will result in elimination.**

Note: fence height at Final 1.00m (4 year olds) and 1.10m (5 year olds).

SECTION III Conformation (12 marks) and Quality (8 marks)

Note: following Section III, the ten horses with the highest marks will proceed to section IV. In the event of equality of marks at this stage, the horse with the higher jumping mark will be given precedence. Should this still produce an equality of marks, all horses on that same jumping mark will come forward.

SECTION IV **Suitability and Potential**

*Top ten horses only are required for this section, to be judged for potential international quality of a WORLD CLASS THREE DAY EVENT HORSE. 5 year olds will be required to **gallop one at a time**. 4 year olds will only be required to show a forward moving canter indicating they could learn to gallop with further development and maturity. It is the responsibility of the rider to ensure they present themselves in time for this section which is scheduled to follow **immediately** after the last horse in Section III, failure to do so may result in elimination.*

Note: in the event of equality of marks after all four sections, the jumping mark will take precedence. Should this still produce equality of marks, the highest mark attained in the final section will be the deciding factor.



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DUBARRY BURGHLEY YOUNG EVENT HORSE SERIES

This hugely popular competition, now in its third decade is integral to Burghley Horse Trials and remains acknowledged as **the** shop window to view potential 'five star' horses at an early age.

Open to four and five year olds, the aim of the Series is to encourage breeders and trainers to produce and present the type of young horse which will be the best material to make a world class three-day event horse.

The judges look for an athletic, loose moving horse with a promising jumping technique and attitude which, with correct training and production, will develop physically and mentally into a strong three-day event horse.

The winner is that with the highest overall marks from four sections:

Section I	Dressage	Marked out of 30
Section II	Jumping up to 0.90m for 4 year olds and up to 1.05m for 5 year olds	Marked out of 40
Section III	Conformation (12 marks) & Quality (8 marks)	Marked out of 20
Section IV	Suitability & Potential	1-10 marks

Dressage: a simple dressage test is ridden to demonstrate obedience, suppleness and, good elastic and regular gaits. Marks are not awarded for individual movements.

Jumping: follows immediately after the dressage. Judges are looking for a bold athletic horse with good technique. A horse should not necessarily be penalised for knocking down **one fence** (or even a four year old having one refusal), providing he learns from his mistake. However, a fall of horse or rider or three cumulative refusals will result in elimination.

Conformation and Quality: assessed in hand. The horses' build and type should enable them to withstand the demands of the sport in terms of soundness, speed and stamina.

Suitability and Potential: the top ten highest scoring horses from sections I – III are invited into the Ring to be assessed on potential quality for international competition. The horses are called into line in the order that the judge sees their potential. Ten marks will be awarded to the horse that the judge selects first, 9 to the second, 8 to the third, etc down to 1 mark to the tenth horse. These marks are added to those from the previous 3 sections to establish the winner

One horse per 15 starters at today's event will qualify for the Dubarry Burghley Young Event Horse Finals which take place **on the first day of this year's Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials – Wednesday, 2 September**.
